Listening to children read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Once children are able to read fluently, and with expression, hold discussions around their comprehension of the texts. If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books and share their own favourite stories with you. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:

We would like you to encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in the homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

Share in discussion what plants you have in your garden. What songs can you sing on your own? Do you know any actions to your songs or can you make up your own?</p>

<p>Can you explore different textures. Create a insect or garden creature by collaging using different materials. You can use tissue paper, newspaper, cut out from a magazine, tin foil, feathers, sand. Any different textured materials you like. Discuss with your grown ups what the textures feel like ? What does the Sainsburys logo look like? Where is the NHS logo? For example a butterfly? A worm? A bird etc. Don't forget your tripod grip and begin to use shape in your drawing.</p>	<p>Can you go on a Nature walk, search in your garden or out in the local area for insects, bugs etc. Can you find any creatures, birds etc? What do they look like? Share in discussion how to care for them. What could you feed them? What do their mummies or babies look like.
