We would like you to encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded ( if appropriate) in the homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

<p>Can you go on a woodland walk find a rock or two. Paint the rock for your garden or paint the rock for a member of your family to put in their garden. Don't forget to use shape in your drawing. Can you label your drawing with the first sound you hear or write the word? Your grown ups can help you. Don't forget to form the letters correctly.</p> <div style="text-align: center; margin-top: 10px;">  </div> <p>Find a quiet place to read your favourite stories outside, maybe in your tent you have made.</p>	<p>Share in conversation with your grown ups about moving onto your new classes/teachers into reception. Talk about your favourite memories in your current class with your friends and teachers.
