

Our Curriculum



We have identified key, life long skills which we believe are integral to the future success of our children as life long learners. We call them our Curriculum Drivers. Our whole school curriculum provision develops and embeds these skills through a progressive and sequential approach. Our curriculum has been designed with our school context, resources and pupils in mind. For more information please visit our website and click on Our School, Curriculum and scroll down.



In English lessons your child will have the opportunity to listen to, read and write in different styles (genres) such as instructions, stories and reports, to name but a few. They will use speaking and listening, and drama to support and inspire their writing.



In Maths lessons your child will develop a variety of strategies in mental and written maths using the CPAR model concrete (using objects such as Numicon, counters etc) pictorial (drawing), abstract (doing it in their head) and reasoning. We use White Rose Maths and other resources to

other resources to compliment and expand their knowledge.

Our Themes This Year...



Ay Up Duck!

As we welcome the children back to a new school year we begin with a fabulous topic—Ay up duck. During this topic we focus on our own Potteries heritage and learn about the history of The Six Towns, famous Stokies and the industries that were, and are still part of our history.



Terrific Tudors

After the Christmas break we move onto the 'Terrific Tudors' topic. During this term we will learn about famous Tudors, their way of life and adventures.



In the Summer term we will explore life in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We will learn about the food, religion, homes, technology and art and how these areas developed and changed over time. In Year 4 children take part in a statutory times tables check, which is a little like the year 1 phonics check. To make this process much less stressful, each year group focusses on a limited number of times tables to learn and recall quickly. By the end of year 3 we need



the children to recall 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 10's times tables facts, so that hopefully they will confidently know and recall all of them by the time of the assessment in year 4.



Your child will **NEED** to bring their reading book and planner in their folder **EVERYDAY!** We shall hear your child read individually on their own as often as we can. Your child will also take part in our ERIC (everyone reading in class) lessons and will read a range of books by different authors.

Your child will also be able to borrow a book from our school library every fortnight.

Homework will be sent home each half term on a homework menu and will be based on the learning that has taken place the half term before so that your child can apply what they have learnt.

Your child can choose the activities they wish to complete BUT they MUST complete at least three activities. Work can be completed and returned by email or in the home learning book which will be collected at the end of each half term.

SET MENU

Weekly spellings using Spelling Shed Daily reading- just a couple of pages followed by a discussion about what has been read. Counting in 2's, 5's, 10's, 3's, 4's 8's and 6's Timestable Rockstars

CHOICE MENU

We add a variety of choices including design it, write it, explore it, perform it etc—these vary each half term to try to inspire everyone. Pick at least three of these each half term
