

We have identified key, life long skills which we believe are integral to the future success of our children as life long learners. We call them our Curriculum Drivers. Our whole school curriculum provision develops and embeds these skills through a progressive and sequential approach. In English lessons your child will have the opportunity to listen to. read and write in different styles (genres) such as instructions, stories and reports, to name but a few. They will use speaking and listening, and drama to support and inspire their writing.



In Maths lessons your child will develop a variety of strategies in mental and written maths using the CPAR model concrete (using objects such as Numicon, counters etc) pictorial (drawing), abstract (doing it in their head) and reasoning. We use White Rose Maths and other resources to compliment and expand their knowledge.

Our Themes This Year...



Marvellous Me

We will learn all about what makes us marvellous! We will think about how we have changed since being born and discuss things that have happened in that time, such as how our own toys have changed. We will think about our own family and how they are similar and how they are different to other families. We will explore our local area and what our homes are like, comparing them to what they were like in the past thinking about what is similar and what is different. We will draw and paint pictures of ourselves and things that are important to us.



Famous for more than five minutes

We will study people who have made significant contributions both nationally and internationally. We will learn about their achievements and try some projects in their areas of expertise such as art, music, leadership, science, adventuring and invention. We will become outdoor adventurers as we explore our school grounds, including taking part in our Forest School sessions. We will be inspired by these role models to dream of what we might achieve in the future!



We are Britain

We will learn about the countries and capitals of the UK, thinking about what makes them special. We will learn how to bake a tasty delight from each of the four countries. We will find out about the Monarchy and compare Queen Elizabeth II with Queen Victoria. We will learn fundamental information (linked to British Values), key geographical vocabulary and important skills such as using maps, atlases and globes. We will discover seaside towns in Great Britain and think about the coming of railways and the history of Seaside Holidays.





Here at Knypersley First School we follow the **Little Wandle Letters and Sounds** phonics and early reading scheme. Learning to become a reader is a very important aspect our little ones lives. By working together, consistently and with enthusiasm we can all make a huge difference in the development and progress of reading!

Phonics is a way of teaching children to read quickly and skilfully. They are taught how to:

- * Recognise the sounds that individual letters make
- * Identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make-such as 'sh' or 'oo'
- * Blend these sounds together from left to right to make a word

children are taught to read words by blending, which means pushing all the sounds together to make a word. The children are taught to spell words by segmenting, which means sounding out words and writing down the sounds they can hear.

Your child will **NEED** to bring their reading book and planner in their folder **EVERYDAY!** We shall hear your child read as part of a group three times a week. E Books to practice reading will be allocated on Wednesdays.


Your child will also be able to borrow a sharing book from our school library each week to promote the love of reading.
