Listening to children read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Once children are able to read fluently, and with expression, hold discussions around their comprehension of the texts. If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books and share their own favourite stories with you. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:

We would like you to encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in the homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

<p>Choose a favourite story, Can you retell the story from the pictures in the book? Where is the title of the book? Where is the blurb? Who are the characters in the story? What is your favourite part, the beginning, the middle or the end? Take a trip to Biddulph library and choose some new stories to share together.</p>	<p>Find a game at home to share together developing your turn taking skills. Talk about who is coming first, second etc, remember that it is not all about winning, be a good sportsperson and say well done to the person who has won. What is your favourite game? Can you invent your own game to play together and think of some rules together?</p>	<p>Can you pretend to be woodland animal in a forest? Use your role play skills and make up your own story in a wood pretending to be different animals with your family? <p>Be as creative as you like! Can you paint a picture of a woodland animal? E.g. a spider, a mouse, a owl. Or if it is closer to Christmas, can you paint Santa or a snowman. Don't forget we have been learning how to hold a paintbrush correctly and use shape within our paintings. Can you add detail into your painting?</p> <p>Can you go on a hunt in your garden and collect some sticks. Can you create a hedgehog out of play-doh and use your sticks for its spikes. What other woodland animals can you create? Be as creative as you like.</p>	<p>Can you draw a Mouse with Squiggle on You Tube.
