Set Menu: spellings, daily reading, phonics practice

We will be looking for children to read at least three times a week at home with their parents. Listening to them read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Remember to give them lots of praise—celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together. As part of our homework policy we recommend that children read for 5-10 minutes each night. Please can you continue to record this in your child's home school links book. If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books. We want them to foster a love of books,. So please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:

We will encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but **NO LESS** than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in our homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.
