What is the Prevent Strategy?

Prevent is a government strategy designed to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorist or extremist causes. The strategy covers all types of terrorism and extremism, including the extreme far-right wing and extreme Islamist groups.



How does the Prevent Strategy apply to schools and parents?

From July 2015 all schools have a duty to safeguard children from radicalisation and extremism. This means we have a responsibility to protect children from extremism and violent views the same way we protect them from online dangers, drugs or gang violence.

As part of the February INSET day staff will complete the latest PREVENT training in line with the updated guidance and information from the government (December 2023). The course outlines Prevent duty, the forms of extremism and terrorism threatening the UK and develops staff knowledge around the risks of radicalisation and the supportive role of staff.

Staff Training, Key Documents and Policies
