If you have any questions after the workshops, or if you couldn't make it and would like more information, please remember teachers hold weekly drop-in sessions that can be booked through Arbor.

Today, lines and roles for our upcoming nativities and winter performances have been sent home with the children, giving everyone plenty of time to prepare. If your child's letter didn't quite make it home, please let their class teacher know via Arbor and they will happily replace it. For Reception and Year 4 families who have been asked to sign up to one of two slots, please wait for guidance from teachers around timescales and the opening of the booking system. As a reminder, the total number of guests has been carefully risk assessed and arranged around fire safety requirements. This is not only to

keep the audience safe, but also to make sure that in the unlikely event of an emergency, children can be moved quickly and safely through the fire exits. For this reason, we will be sticking to 3 tickets per family. We also ask that everyone brings their tickets on the night so we can monitor numbers and ensure we remain within safety regulations.

Thank you, as always, for being such an important part of our school community. We are so proud of the children and grateful for the support you give each week.



I am an Education Mental Health
Practitioner (EMHP) and my role involves
supporting young people and their
familied with mild to moderate mental
health challenges using Low intensity
cognitive behavioural therapy (LICBT).
Together we work to identify and address
difficult emotions and feelings.

I work in partnership with the school's Mental Health Lead to deliver a whole school approach to mental health; this includes educational workshops, groups, and training to reduce the stigma of mental health and improve outcomes for the whole school community.






