Social, Emotional, Mental Health Support at Kingsfield First School

At Kingsfield First School, we are proud of the strong support we provide for pupils' mental health and emotional wellbeing. This term, we have been proud to see our assemblies exploring our Trust and School Values, helping children understand the importance of respect, responsibility, and kindness. Our staff have worked hard to develop strong emotional connections with pupils by gaining an in-depth understanding of their needs and backgrounds, creating classrooms that feel safe, consistent, and welcoming. Together, adults and children have co-created clear, collaborative rules and routines, which are displayed and regularly referred to, ensuring high expectations for learning and behaviour. Praise is personalised and focused on positive conduct, supported by visual tools such as Behaviour Trackers and Emotion Boards. Children have access to calming spaces, Worry Monsters, and Zones of Regulation to help them manage feelings, while opportunities like Circle Time, PSHRE lessons, and pupil voice surveys encourage reflection and dialogue. Leadership roles, peer mediation, and structured interventions further strengthen our community, ensuring every child feels valued and supported. Through these shared efforts, we continue to foster an environment where respect, resilience, and emotional wellbeing thrive.

Another of the key ways we support our pupils with their mental health is through the ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) programme. ELSA gives children the time and space to explore and understand their emotions, while learning strategies to manage them effectively. Through this nurturing approach, pupils develop empathy, resilience and respect for the feelings of others. By prioritising emotional wellbeing alongside academic success, we help every child feel valued, supported and ready to thrive.

We have been proud to collaborate with Kathryn from the Mental Health Support Team, who recently delivered engaging parental workshops on the '5 Ways to Wellbeing'. These sessions provided practical strategies and activities designed to empower parents and children to nurture positive mental health and resilience at home and in school.

At Marlfields, we are working hard to develop a love for reading across the school. We do this through our amazing new library space, our book club, Marvellous Readers team and visiting Congleton Library. Children take part in discreet reading lessons, phonics lessons in KS1 and additional reading interventions across the whole school.

Our new library - We are lucky to have such a huge space to enjoy reading. Our library is separated into genre sections. From graphic novels, non-fiction to inspirational people; we have it all! Classes visit fortnightly to take books home and enjoy them with their family.

Book Club – Our weekly after-school Book Club allows children to spend time in the library reading for pleasure but also to be the first person to open new book deliveries! They help to select the fiction and non-fiction 'books of the month' along with a book about an inspirational person. The members are also kept busy keeping the library tidy and organising the returned books.

Marvellous Readers Team

There are two representatives from each class on the Marvellous Readers Team. They have showcased a love for reading and have been selected to promote reading across the school. They help to make selections for new books, read stories and poems to other classes and help with assemblies and competitions.

Reading Interventions

Children in all classes have1-2-1 reading each week to practice their fluency and deepen their understanding. Everyone reads one level above their book band to expose them to new vocabulary and texts.

Pupils also take part in the Little Wandle Rapid Catch-up programme to accelerate their progress.
